Introduction

Space Hub Yorkshire supports Manufacturing Opportunities in the Space Sector

The space sector is a vital part of the UK's economy, worth more than £16.4 billion per year and employing more than 45,000 – but most people don't know much about it.

Space plays a critical role in our daily lives. Satellites orbiting the Earth only 160 kilometres above our heads keep us connected with our friends, families and colleagues. They support our present and future security and prosperity, enabling us to navigate the oceans, keep people safe, monitor the climate and forecast the weather.

Space presents significant opportunities. The global space economy is projected to grow from an estimated £270 billion in 2019 to £490 billion by 2030.

In light of this, University of Sheffield's Advanced Manufacturing Research Centre (AMRC), Space Hub Yorkshire and the Satellite Applications Catapult, organised this first regional event to showcase **Opportunities for Manufacturing in the UK Space Sector.**

The half day networking event brought together speakers from key players in the space sector including Thales Alenia Space, Satellite Applications Catapult and Reliance Precision, aiming to boost the awareness of opportunities in the space sector for new and existing manufacturing businesses and support the Space economy in the region. This event provided information on how the space sector is relevant to diverse manufacturing businesses from many sectors, and how space technology can help innovate businesses.

This event was delivered in person at the AMRC Knowledge Transfer Centre on 26 April 2022, 09:30 – 14:00 including a networking lunch to conclude the event.

The event had three organising partners. The Advanced Manufacturing Research Centre, Space Hub Yorkshire and Satellite Applications Catapult.




Figure 2: Event organisers

Space Hub Yorkshire


